Greetings NUMC! It is hard to believe that I am writing for the May/June newsletter! I pray that this edition finds you well, and enveloped by God's grace!

We had a prayerful Lenten, and Easter season together, with our worship blessed each week by Brandon's music, our dynamic choir, and many guest musicians. Thanks also to Cheryl Assimon for leading and creating our altar decorations, which this year included a life- sized tomb, complete with prayer stations, and space to find quiet within! We will wrap up our Easter season together on May 19th, with our celebration of Pentecost.

I am excited to share with you that our 55 Maxwell Planning Committee met this past week and is taking some initial steps to begin opening up our beautiful property for use by our congregation. These first steps include... 1. Purchasing three park benches to be placed in some quiet spots, in order for people to have the opportunity to gather, to sit and to pray, or to have conversations with friends! These benches will be made of poly-plastic material and will require little to no maintenance. We will also look for ways to fasten the benches in place. 2. To make our property useful for our children and youth, we will be acquiring the materials to build something called a "Ga-Ga" pit. In basic terms it is a circle, made from wood, within which kids place a modified game with a ball. I encourage you to google it for a true explanation! This will come in the form of a kit, which will need to be assembled, but I am also looking for the possibilities of the company we buy it from, also assembling it. More to come with that. 3. The committee will be looking at acquiring some wildflowers that we can plant in some of the wetter areas, and also so we can eliminate the need to mow some areas. This step will come after research is done about which flowers would be best. 4. On Sunday June 9th, we will gather on the new property for coffee hour! This will be our first official use of the property, and we will have something simple like juice and cookies. If it rains, we'll try again the following week! 5. We would like to have our annual fall, back to church picnic here. Date and logistics to be determined!

Many thanks to all who have donated time, funds, and many prayers to the preparation of this new property. The committee and I look forward to seeing it in use, and look forward to the many ways it will bless our congregation and our community in the years to come. If you should have any questions, please email or call me, or connect with someone on the committee. We will keep you posted as these things above begin to take shape.

ALZHEIMER'S VOLUNTEER CARE TEAMS

Eddy Alzheimer's Care Teams exist to provide support and companionship to individuals with some form of memory loss, by providing much needed respite to caregivers and socialization to the person with the disease. These caring individuals strive to make life better for both the caregiver and the patient.

The Alzheimer's Care Team, consisting of 4-10 volunteers from the local community, is matched up with a family in their area. Trained volunteers are available to assist families for a few hours each week free of charge. Training generally takes place at your organization and runs about 2.5 hours.

Volunteers are recruited from communities across the Capital Region and are trained by Eddy staff about dementia and the best approaches to care. Many of our volunteers were family caregivers. Confidentiality is maintained. Eddy staff continues to meet with the team to provide support and guidance. All volunteers provide personal references.

As part of the Team, volunteers provide friendship and non-medical support to both the individual who has dementia and the family members who are involved. Examples of volunteer activities may include: lending a listening ear, visiting for socialization, running errands, picking up groceries or a prescription at the pharmacy, listening to music or watching a ballgame, taking a walk, visiting a museum or enjoying other community outings, delivering a hot meal, preparing lunch — and providing the caregiver "a break" and much needed respite!

Hours of volunteering are flexible and up to individual volunteer. Team works together to create schedule of volunteering. Expectation to meet with Team every six weeks for an hour.

A Volunteer needs no previous experience. One needs only a desire to support a neighbor. Volunteers will be required to attend training prior to volunteering and to complete and submit applicable paperwork including references. Training includes information on Dementia, caregiving, communication strategies, and other resources.

Volunteers will meet every six weeks at a location convenient for the volunteer. Volunteering will be done within the volunteer's local community.
